

One incident resulted in chewed up pants and the other resulted in a pilot dropping his radio and damaging it. **DO NOT TAXI INTO OR OUT OF THE PITS!** Always power down your airplane with it pointed away from the pit

area or parallel to the pit.

Randy reported on a check received from **Vern Godfrey's** widow Suzy that she donated to the club from the sale of R/C related items.

Randy reminded us of the Air Show event on June 5th in Prescott Valley. We will again participate this year.

Bob Shanks reported on the Embry Riddle airplane project and its 2 successful flights see page 5.

Glenn Hiethold showed the Kougar 60 size airplane kit that we are raffling off. Only 50 tickets will be sold at \$5.00 a ticket.


Dennis O'Connor reported on

SAFETY IS ALWAYS AN ISSUE

Well members we had another incident in the pit area with a plane pointed into the pits and the pilot losing control and dropping his radio but thankfully we didn't have any injuries.

We can and did go for years without this happening but that's why all the clubs I've been associated with prohibit taxing into or out of the pit area. We have repeatedly hit this safety item in this column and we are like a broken record but it needs to be reinforced. No one wants an electric or glow plane of any size

jumping to life and cutting up a member working on his plane with his back to the runway or chopping off part of his pants and or leg.

So once again members please hang onto your plane and push it out to the runway area to fly and have it parallel to the pits when you shut it down or even pointed across the runway after flying.

With the very thin and sharp electric props and now large electric planes available with tremendous power we could have a serious accident. We do have a first aid kit at the field but we probably should check it frequently for supplies. We will have our safety officer **Tom Root** keep tabs on this little kit. Your editor always has a little one in his vehicle as well.

A word of caution about electrics is always in order, since they just need some battery power to come to life. Many of our planes have the safety of the speed control letting you know the plane is "armed" and read to go but they still can come to life suddenly if the throttle setting or another electrical problem exists.

One member, who was just getting into electrics summed it up well when he said you have to flip over the fuel engines to start but not so with electrics that's why we never arm them in the cabana area, always in the pit area. We always have a number of members and other spectators sitting under the cabana watching the flying. We don't want anyone there injured either. So with the new flying season upon us and more of our members flying please think **SAFETY** my friends.
