Construction Tip

When installing Robart pin hinges getting both to perfectly match is a problem.

On the stabilizer (in this case three hinges on each side) mark out where you want the holes, then clip off ¼ inch of T-Pin tip and, using pliers, push the short pin into the stabilizer where marked. Leave about 1/8 inch or less sticking out (either end works, but push the pointed end into the stabilizer).

Next make sure the elevator was perfectly aligned with the stabilizer then pressed the two together. The pins left a mark on the elevator (or rudder) where to drill the holes.





Meeting Closed at 8:34 PM



ALWAYS CHECK YOUR CG

A modeler reported to an AMA writer recently that he crashed a new airplane on its first flight. After some research he found that the Center of Gravity (CG) location printed in the manual was off by more than two inches and this tail-heavy condition contributed to the crash.

When he spoke to the distributor about the incident, the company told him the proper CG was in an addendum on its Web site—an addendum that, obviously, was unknown to him. He reported this to me, not only out of personal frustration, but also as a safety issue. The errant model could have caused a lot of damage on its short, first flight.

In its remarks to the modeler, the distributor reported it was not at fault, because it had published the addendum and, additionally, the builder is solely responsible for what happens to his model. As you know, most manuals actually go to great lengths stating the manufacturer and distributor are not responsible for the airplane after it is sold.

When building an ARF, kit or from plans always check the center of gravity before flying. Have someone assist and make sure it's correct. As the old cliché goes, "Never assume, it makes an ass out of you and me". This is a safety issue!

SAFETY IS ALWAYS AN ISSUE

Our club is without a safety officer and according to Jay our planes els that can not built and this little "rag" has a lot of safety items in it each month I recommend that all members read the AMA magazine Model

Aviation each month.

Even if you don't like the magazine or feel it doesn't meet your reading standards please read the monthly safety column if you don't read anything else. Your editor reads this column first before looking at building projects or other

items of interest. We all know our planes are not toys but models that can injure and maim if not built and flown properly.

The article is entitled "Safety Comes First" and is written by Dave Gee.

We do discuss safety at each of our monthly meetings and we and most clubs have a safety officer.

We also try to correct each other when we make mistakes. We all can monitor each other and we do. We still need a safety officer or safety contact.

Your editor has belonged to 5 clubs and all of them had someone who wore the safety hat.

So members, anyone interested? Please contact any of the board members if you are interested in being a safety contact or safety officer.

In Dave's column this month he tells of how a 4 stroke engine started by itself because the glow driver had been left on or turned to high, the prop just happened to be in the compression cycle and the engine started
