Embry-Riddle's Career Expo Oct. 6 featured the ERAU jet dragster and Aerobatic Eagle 580 at the Prescott airport. The dragster is capable of 300 mph+ speeds. The dragster is powered by a 5000 HP J-85 with 5200 pounds of thrust. Burns 2 gallons of fuel per second. G-Forces are 5.0 at launch and 7.0 during parachute deployment. *Elaine Larsen* drives; only one of three women drive jet dragsters. The career Expo featured 50 companies many out looking for ERAU graduates to hire.

- Membership is at 101
- \$18,000 was spent on improvements
- We represented the Town of Chino Valley at the Annual E-Fest held in Mesa, Arizona each January.
- New North-South runway is now graded, just looking for a way to get it paved

- We hosted the RCPro war bird races drawing pilots from 5 states
- Our annual Air Show was fairly well attended but we feel some were kept away because of weather. The big wind and hail storm moved through later that day. We opened our air show with a flyover of 2 L-39 jets, one being flown by Galpin Ford's owner. We also had two ultra-lights land for a display along with a helicopter flown in by Guidance Aviation.
- Food was catered Chino Valley's own Big Daddy E's catering. We also had three vendors selling RC products.
- We interviewed 161 spectators and found 26 came from over 50 miles away.
- Sunday was a weather blow out.







By a majority vote it is no longer required to have a licensed driver with you while flying. The vote was 18 – 1 with 14 persons not voting.

You may come to the field and fly solo. However, CVMA suggests that it is a good practice to have another licensed driver at the field at the time you are flying. As always, you fly at your own risk.

Vice President *Bob Noulin* showed his Laser 200 with a Sato 180 engine and Pitts Muffler. Bob also demonstrated a home made balancing stand. *Rick Nichols* showed his not-yet crashed Fun-Cub. We wish to thank *Kris Johnson* for the great brownies. They were delicious.



SAFETY IS ALWAYS AN ISSUE

As you have read in our meeting minutes from page 6, we have changed the rule about flying alone. You can now fly alone but after much discussion we also want to emphasize the need to have others present due to snakes during the summer, prop or other accidents.

Many clubs have this rule some don't. With the proliferation of cell phones safety has improved but should someone be flying alone and inadvertently have an accident help is but a call away.

Not too many years ago a flyer had a severe prop cut while flying alone and attempted to drive himself to the hospital but died on the way due to blood loss.

While these kinds of accidents do occur, and are rare we need to be aware of the many safety issues that can occur when flying alone.

For that matter, working alone in your workshop can be just as dangerous if good safety thinking is used.

So members, you can fly

alone but do use some thought about what kind of airplane you are flying and follow your own safety procedures.

If you are flying a new airplane, it is always advisable to wait for someone else to assist just as a matter of good safety sense.

On another note, member *Allan Collins* has offered to assist folks in getting a plane set up and ready to fly or helping with servo layout and safety checks. He did volunteer to work with folks at the field. So

don't hesitate to ask him. We have so many members willing to help others so for safety don't hesitate to ask for help you could save that airplane and prevent a possible safety problem.

We tend to overlook items like cracked props, or even slightly damaged props, these should be changed.

Do develop your own pre flight safety check of control surface operations and any other safety items you feel are important for how you fly.
