
Since we vote on 2015 officers next month, Rick reviewed the current nominations. More nominations can be accepted next month as well.



# DON'T FORGET TO LOCK THE GATE <u>MEMBERS:</u> LOCK THE GATE WHEN LEAVING, IF YOU ARE THE LAST ONE OUT. <u>WE ALL MUST REMEMBER TO LOCK THE GATE</u>. THIS MEANS SPINNING THE LOCK A FEW TIMES AFTER FASTENING IT TAKING IT OFF THE COMBINATION NUMBER.

# SAFETY IS ALWAYS AN ISSUE

We have sighted a snake or two at the field so if you land out in the high grass and weeds please drive out to get your plane and <u>make sure you don't drive</u> <u>on the runway</u>, it will not support a car or truck, drive around it.

Always look down when walking anywhere at the field for critters and snakes have been spotted in the parking area too.

I received a safety note about an incident with a Spectrum radio, and we have a lot of members using them at our field.

A modeler installed an ener-

gizing plug that turns on the ESC and receivers when activated or pulled. This modeler turned on his radio and even though the plug was inserted his prop started spinning! Another modeler <u>using a different make of radio</u> has his on and it is controlling the model with the energizing plug? The modeler pulls out his energizing plug and then puts in back in and then everything is ok, a very strange anomaly.

His concern, along with many, is that the 2.4 Ghz radios are suppose to locate open channels but apparently in this rare case things didn't work quite right.

When using new equipment and additions I suppose it is a good idea to operationally double check everything one can and test out the equipment as much as is possible. However, with electronic equipment strange interferences can occur. Just be aware is about all one can do. When turning on your radio check to see who else is flying just as a matter of procedure, who knows when a gremlin will strike.


### NAME THAT PLANE: THE ROYAL AIR FORCE AVRO VULCAN BY HAWKER SIDDELELY



The Avro Vulcan (officially <u>Hawker Siddeley</u> Vulcan<sup>[2]</sup> from July 1963)<sup>[3]</sup> is a <u>jet-powered delta wing strategic bomber</u>, which was operated by the <u>Royal Air Force</u> (RAF) from 1956 until 1984. Aircraft manufacturer A.V. Roe and Company (<u>Avro</u>) designed the Vulcan in response to <u>Specification B.35/46</u>. Of the three <u>V bombers</u> produced, the Vulcan was considered the riskiest option. Several scale aircraft, designated <u>Avro 707</u>, were produced to test and refine the delta wing design principles.

The Vulcan B.1 was first delivered to the RAF in 1956; deliveries of the improved Vulcan B.2 started in 1960. The B.2 featured more powerful engines, a larger wing, an improved electrical system and <u>electronic countermeasures</u> (ECM); many were modified to accept the <u>Blue Steel</u> missile. As a part of the <u>V-force</u>, the Vulcan was the backbone of the United Kingdom's airborne nuclear deterrent during much of the <u>Cold</u> <u>War</u>. Although the Vulcan was typically armed with <u>nuclear weapons</u>, it was capable of conventional bombing missions, a capability which was used in <u>Operation Black Buck</u> during the <u>Falklands War</u> between the United Kingdom and Argentina in 1982.

The Vulcan had no defensive weaponry, initially relying upon highspeed high-altitude flight to evade interception. Electronic countermeasures were employed by the B.1 (designated B.1A) and B.2 from circa 1960. A change to low-level tactics was made in the mid-1960s. In the mid-1970s nine Vulcans were adapted for maritime radar reconnaissance operations, <u>redesignated</u> as B.2 (MRR). In the final years of service six Vulcans were converted to the K.2 tanker configuration for <u>aerial refuelling</u>. Since retirement by the RAF one example, B.2 <u>XH558</u>, named "The Spirit of Great Britain" has been restored for use in display flights and air shows, whilst two other B.2s, <u>XL426</u> and <u>XM655</u>, are kept in taxiable condition for ground runs and demonstrations at <u>London Southend Airport</u> and Wellesbourne Mountford Airfield respectively.

Steve Crowe flew Hurricanes with 257 Squadron RAF and undertook his first combat operation in November 1941. Along with other Americans he was then posted to join 133 Eagle Squadron, flying Spitfires, transferring to the USAAF in September 1942 as the 336th Fighter Squadron. He flew over 70 combat missions in both the European and Mediterranean theatres of operations. Our good friend passed away in 2009.
